

23<sup>rd</sup> November – Christ the King 30<sup>th</sup> November – Advent Sunday


#### Vayrac News


Diamond Jubilee Celebrations at Toulouse

We have been celebrating our 60th Anniversary throughout the year and the pinnacle was our Celebration Service on 21st September. We chose September as that was the month that the church was founded back in 1965 when, prompted by a conversation after the baptism of the son of John and Jenny Prince, the Chaplain from Pau, Rev Walter Barnes, began to celebrate a monthly service in the "Chapelle McCarthy". Fast forward to 2025 and having had 15 Chaplains and 9 Chapels / Churches to workshop in, we met together for a service of Holy Communion and celebration led by Rev Canon Tony Jewiss assisted by Kate du Toit. There was much singing, led by the music group, with some of the congregation's favourite hymns they had chosen for our "Songs of Praise" service. Tony's sermon looked back over 60 years and forward to the future. It was very thought provoking, and the words: "You have faithfully represented the Anglican Way, a beacon of faithfulness and reason in this corner of the world, joining with others, in every other corner of the world of similar mind and purpose. The wider world at this time in history is in desperate need of Matthew's gospel message, to know love and trust in Jesus Christ and to seek peace by following his way" stood out.

We initiated a "Time Capsule" with items from our past / present and hopes and prayers for the future. The capsule will remain open for a short while to enable maximum participation and then will be sealed for 10 years! Roll on 2035!

Towards the end of the service, we lit candles as a sign of us taking Christ's light into our homes and communities.

Our congregation comprised people from 9 nationalities, from our past and present - from near and far (Kudos to Debbie for flying in from the States!). It was great to see Rev Laurie again, and also lovely to receive video and written messages from France, UK, Brussels, USA and New Zealand. Our corner of the world here has expanded somewhat! We



also had representatives from Brens, Cahors and Carcassonne, and the RC church congregation and this added to the family feel of the occasion.

It really was a lovely service, and was followed by one of Zena's celebration cakes (thanks Zena!) and some bubbly (thanks to Steve) to accompany lots of reminiscing, chatting, laughing and watching some videos of a church picnic in the Lot in 1998 and a Holy Communion service on the col d'Ordino, Andorra in 2000 (Thanks to John Passingham). We also looked at some of the photos that congregation members had sent in - what treasures!

Finally, we had a bring and share lunch (what else?) to top off our time together!






#### A wonderful, wonderful Day



## New Chaplaincy website!



We made €500 with €50 of that going to LightBeam







A Wonderful Weekend at the Abbaye de Cadouin! The choir Canta Vivace, of which Martin and Fran Milnes, Howard Bould, and several members of the Cahors Occasional Choir at Easter, Harvest, and Nine Lessons and Carols are members, organised a seemingly impossible weekend on 20 and 21 September - singing Rutter's Requiem from scratch rehearsed and conducted by Sir John Rutter himself just before his 80<sup>th</sup> birthday. We attracted a total of 97 singers from choirs all over the South West and further afield. Sir John was terrific, including handling a total electrical breakdown in the whole area (which as he pointed out occurred during rehearsal of the movement 'Lux Aeterna'), and the audience at the closing concert on the Sunday afternoon was about 150strong - and we turned many away because of a limit on the number permitted in the abbey at one time! 


